
The City of Lenoir is located in the heart of Caldwell County, North Carolina and is approximately 16 square miles in size. Almost 18,000 people call Lenoir home.



Duties

Lenoir Police Officers are responsible for the enforcement of state and city laws and regulations. Officers patrol an assigned area, give assistance to motorists and other citizens, safeguard property, direct traffic, and investigate accidents. In 2015, the Police Department processed more than 48,000 calls for service.

They make preliminary investigations of any type of crime or complaint; make a report of findings and enlist further aid, if necessary, to apprehend violators of the law; appear in court as witnesses; and assist other law enforcement agencies.

Employment Qualifications

Applicants must have the ability to understand and carry out the mission of the Lenoir Police Department while respecting the values of the City and the Department.

Applicants must also meet the following requirements:

1. Must be a United States Citizen
2. Must be a High School Graduate or have a GED.
3. Must be at least 20 years of age
4. Must possess a valid driver's license and have been licensed to drive for a minimum of one year, with no loss of license within the past year and an acceptable driving record in accordance with the City of Lenoir Driving Standard. Must possess a North Carolina driver's license prior to beginning employment.
5. Veterans must provide proof of military service (DD-214).
6. Must be of good moral character with no record of conviction by any local, state, federal, or military court of a felony or Class A or Class B misdemeanors as defined by the Training and Standards Commission (0111)(3).
7. All applicants for Police Officer must also satisfactorily complete the following:
